# Where Do We Feel at Home

DEAR COLLEAGUES,

**Where Do We Feel At Home?: Self Psychological Perspectives of Belonging and Not Belonging** – Traditional psychoanalytic theory tended to view complaints about feelings of estrangement, loneliness, and alienation, as stemming from unresolved intrapsychic disturbances and fixations. Self Psychology has taught us the importance of considering the contextual factors in bringing about individual, subjective suffering. Our **37th Annual Conference of the Psychology of the Self** will examine sociopolitical, psychosocial, interpersonal and intra-psychic aspects of ethnicity, community, religion, gender, and sexual orientation - amongst a range of possible dimensions affecting subjective experiences of belonging and not belonging. In this sense then, the conference will be looking at individual and group experiences of acceptance and feeling welcome, and/or experiences of rejection and exclusion. We recognize that holding the IASP conference in Jerusalem has stirred a great deal of controversy. We want to reaffirm our commitment to the belief that conflict is best resolved through open dialogue. To that end, we will provide opportunities for the open discussion of conflicting perspectives on issues affecting the region in which all voices will be heard. We look forward to an enriching exchange. The conference will consist of Plenary Presentations, with Faculty, Audience, and Post Panel Group Discussions. There will also be Workshops, Meet the Author Session, and parallel Original Paper Presentations.

Our **Tuesday and Wednesday PreConference** features topical subjects in contemporary self psychology, as well as an additional program that will acknowledge and attempt to address the complex and painful religious, political and cultural struggles in the region where the conference takes place. **Plenary One** looks at the conference theme as it pertains to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict from a literary and a clinical-theoretical perspective, with a keynote address by David Grossmann, the renowned Israeli Author. **Plenary Two** focuses on impact of migration and cultural difference in a couple case that turned into individual therapy. **Plenary Three** will explore the way in which Self Psychologically informed child analysis deals with a young girl's malaise due her skin color and the resulting profound feeling of not belonging. **Plenary Four** brings us an existential and evolutionary perspective on the experience of belonging and not belonging. It is our privilege to have Ruth Gruenthal present the Kohut Memorial Lecture.

The program includes individual papers sessions, workshops, and a meet-the-author session, selected from a large number of submissions of original work. We invite you to join us for what promises to be a clinically relevant, rich educational experience. In keeping with the theme of the conference, our meetings and social events provide an opportunity to connect with our vibrant, international community of self psychologically informed clinicians in Jerusalem.

3. Identify how experiences of inclusion, acceptance, being welcome and understood as opposed to rejection, exclusion and not being understood, affect psychological development, well-being and relationships.
4. Identify the potential significance, in the course of psychotherapy / psychoanalysis, of transference and counter-transference phenomena to experiences of feeling at home, belonging and not belonging.

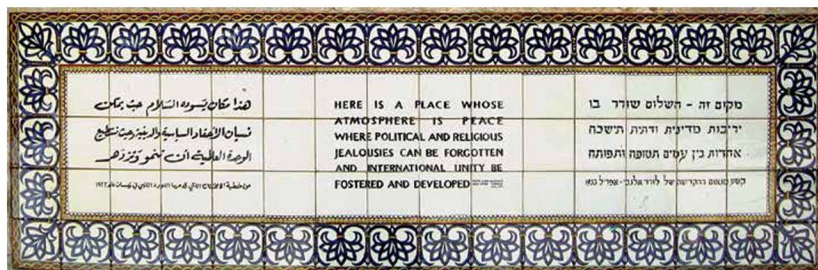
